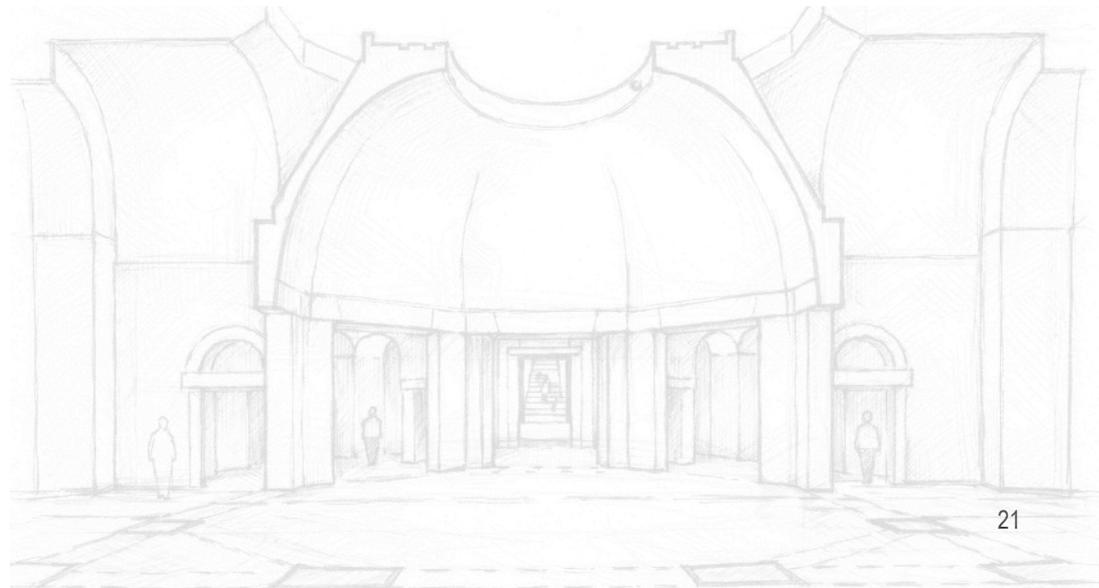

Mostra fotografica | Le mura di Roma nella città contemporanea

La mostra si costruisce come un racconto visivo articolato che affianca alla dimensione scientifica del convegno uno spazio di osservazione diretta e sensibile delle mura romane nella loro condizione attuale. Non un apparato illustrativo, ma un dispositivo interpretativo che mette in relazione tempo, materia e uso, restituendo la complessità di un organismo storico ancora pienamente immerso nella vita della città.

Il nucleo dell'esposizione è costituito da una quadreria di fotografie di Alessandro Lanzetta: una sequenza di immagini presentate come un insieme continuo, quasi un paesaggio visivo unitario, in cui le mura non appaiono come oggetto isolato, ma come presenza diffusa nella città, attraversata dalle pratiche quotidiane e dalle dinamiche della vita urbana. La scelta della quadreria non è soltanto formale. Essa richiama la tradizione dello sguardo sul monumento e sulla rovina, ma al tempo stesso la sovverte, restituendo una visione non celebrativa né distante: le mura appaiono immerse nella città, accostate a infrastrutture, traffico, parcheggi, bambini che giocano, attività informali, presenze vegetali e assetti ruderali. La serialità delle immagini costruisce così un'esperienza di continuità, in cui il monumento non è mai isolato, ma sempre parte di un sistema di relazioni.

Accanto alla quadreria, scorrono in forma video immagini tratte da due distinti filoni di ricerca: da un lato il lavoro di Orazio Carpenzano e Alessandra Criconia, dall'altro quello di Rossana Mancini. Non come materiale espositivo parallelo, ma come livello di lettura che introduce il tempo e la profondità storica all'interno del percorso visivo. Se la fotografia fissa la condizione presente delle mura, il video restituisce la dimensione processuale della loro costruzione e trasformazione: le fasi, le stratificazioni, le interpretazioni, le letture che nel tempo hanno reso intelligibile la loro complessità.

Il dialogo tra quadreria e video costruisce così un doppio regime dello sguardo. Da un lato, la frontalità e la presenza delle fotografie, che mettono il visitatore di fronte alla realtà attuale delle mura, al loro essere infrastruttura urbana, paesaggio e spazio di vita; dall'altro, il flusso delle immagini di ricerca, che introduce il tempo lungo e la dimensione interpretativa, mostrando come ciò che oggi appare come rudere o margine sia l'esito di processi storici stratificati.

In questo connubio tra quadreria e video le mura emergono così non soltanto come monumento, ma come organismo in atto: una soglia urbana che continua a ridefinire il proprio ruolo tra permanenza e trasformazione. Il rudere non è un residuo, ma una forma attraverso cui il tempo si rende visibile nello spazio della città, intrecciandosi con la natura, con le pratiche informali e con le infrastrutture contemporanee.

Photography Exhibition | The Walls of Rome in the Contemporary City

The exhibition is conceived as a structured visual narrative that places, alongside the scientific dimension of the conference, a space for direct and perceptive observation of the Roman walls in their present condition. Not an illustrative apparatus, but an interpretive device that brings time, materiality, and use into relation, conveying the complexity of a historical organism still fully immersed in the life of the city.

The core of the exhibition consists of a quadreria (salon-style hanging) of photographs by Alessandro Lanzetta: a sequence of images presented as a continuous whole, almost a single unified visual landscape, in which the walls do not appear as an isolated object, but as a diffuse presence within the city, traversed by everyday practices and the dynamics of urban life. The choice of the quadreria is not merely formal. It recalls the tradition of viewing the monument and the ruin, while at the same time subverting it, returning a vision that is neither celebratory nor detached: the walls appear embedded in the city, set alongside infrastructure, traffic, parking areas, children playing, informal activities, vegetation, and ruderal landscapes. The seriality of the images thus constructs an experience of continuity, in which the monument is never isolated, but always part of a system of relationships.

Alongside the quadreria, images drawn from two distinct lines of research run in video form: on the one hand the work of Orazio Carpenzano and Alessandra Criconia, on the other that of Rossana Mancini. Not as parallel exhibition material, but as a layer of interpretation that introduces time and historical depth into the visual itinerary. If photography fixes the present condition of the walls, video restores the processual dimension of their construction and transformation: the

phases, stratifications, interpretations, and readings that over time have made their complexity intelligible.

The dialogue between the *quadreria* and the video thus constructs a double regime of vision. On the one hand, the frontality and presence of the photographs, which place the visitor before the current reality of the walls — their being urban infrastructure, landscape, and lived space; on the other, the flow of research images, which introduces the long *durée* and an interpretive dimension, showing how what today appears as ruin or margin is the outcome of stratified historical processes.

In this combination of *quadreria* and video, the walls emerge not only as a monument, but as an organism in action: an urban threshold that continues to redefine its role between permanence and transformation. The ruin is not a residue, but a form through which time becomes visible in the space of the city, intertwining with nature, informal practices, and contemporary infrastructures.

Exposición Fotográfica | Las murallas de Roma en la ciudad contemporánea

La exposición se construye como un relato visual articulado que acompaña la dimensión científica del congreso con un espacio de observación directa y sensible de las murallas romanas en su condición actual. No se trata de un aparato ilustrativo, sino de un dispositivo interpretativo que pone en relación tiempo, materia y uso, restituyendo la complejidad de un organismo histórico aún plenamente inmerso en la vida de la ciudad.

El núcleo de la exposición está constituido por una galería de fotografías de Alessandro Lanzetta: una secuencia de imágenes presentadas como un conjunto continuo, casi como un paisaje visual unitario, en el que las murallas no aparecen como un objeto aislado, sino como una presencia difundida en la ciudad, atravesada por las prácticas cotidianas y las dinámicas de la vida urbana. La elección de la galería no es solamente formal. Remite a la tradición de la mirada sobre el monumento y la ruina, pero al mismo tiempo la subvierte, restituyendo una visión no celebrativa ni distante: las murallas aparecen inmersas en la ciudad, yuxtapuestas a infraestructuras, tráfico, estacionamientos, niños jugando, actividades informales, presencias vegetales y configuraciones ruderales. La serialidad de las imágenes construye así una experiencia de continuidad, en la que el monumento nunca está aislado, sino siempre forma parte de un sistema de relaciones.

Junto a la galería, se proyectan en formato de video imágenes procedentes de dos líneas de investigación distintas: por un lado, el trabajo de Orazio Carpenzano y Alessandra Criconia; por otro, el de Rossana Mancini. No como material expositivo paralelo, sino como un nivel de lectura que introduce el tiempo y la profundidad histórica en el recorrido visual. Si la fotografía fija la condición presente de las murallas, el video restituye la dimensión procesual de su construcción y transformación: las fases, las estratificaciones, las interpretaciones, las lecturas que a lo largo del tiempo han hecho inteligible su complejidad.

El diálogo entre galería y video construye así un doble régimen de la mirada. Por un lado, la frontalidad y la presencia de las fotografías, que sitúan al visitante frente a la realidad actual de las murallas, a su condición de infraestructura urbana, paisaje y espacio de vida; por otro, el flujo de las imágenes de investigación, que introduce el tiempo largo y la dimensión interpretativa, mostrando cómo lo que hoy aparece como ruina o margen es el resultado de procesos históricos estratificados.

En esta conjunción entre galería y video, las murallas emergen así no solo como monumento, sino como organismo en acto: un umbral urbano que continúa redefiniendo su papel entre permanencia y transformación. La ruina no es un residuo, sino una forma a través de la cual el tiempo se hace visible en el espacio de la ciudad, entrelazándose con la naturaleza, con las prácticas informales y con las infraestructuras contemporáneas.
